

REMITTANCES DATA DASHBOARD

Remittances continue to play a critical role in Uganda's economy, supporting households, financial inclusion, The Bank of Uganda previously collected remittance data under the BoP framework using **Annual Personal Transfer Surveys (APTS)** and aggregated submissions from commercial banks and forex bureaus. While this approach ensured consistency with international standards, it offered limited scope and granularity and was released with a lag of over one year.

Commencing in **May 2025**, a new methodology was introduced to enhance the scope to include mobile money and fintech payment methods in a more frequent manner. The approach enhances transparency, provides richer insights into Inbound and Outbound remittance dynamics, which supports evidence-based policy formulation. Importantly, the data undergoes the full lifecycle of collection, validation, analysis, and dissemination, and is treated with strict confidentiality.

The data collected is currently **tentative and subject to refinement** as additional information and data points are incorporated. The consolidated data is published through a **public dashboard**, updated monthly, to provide stakeholders with accessible and timely insights.
